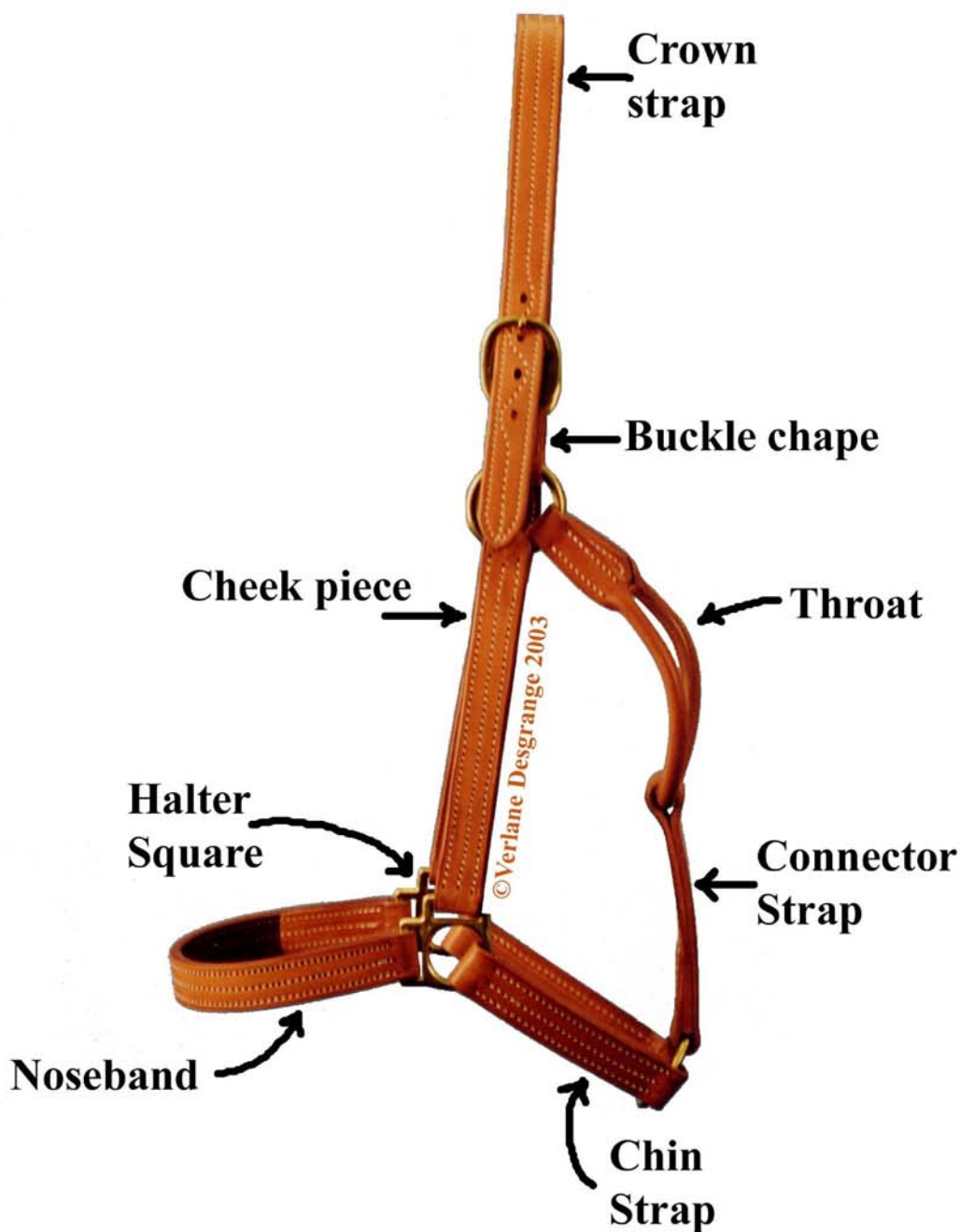
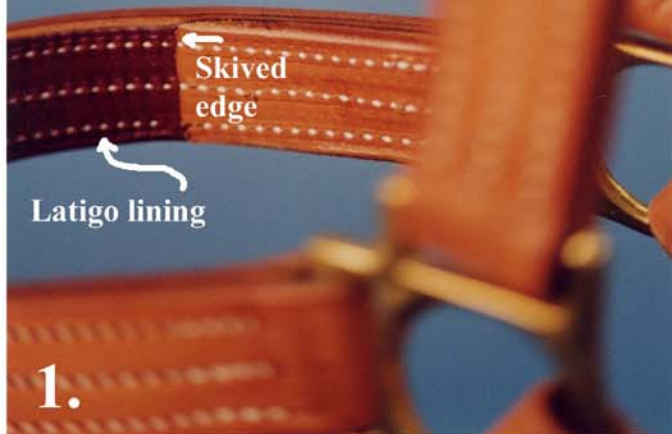


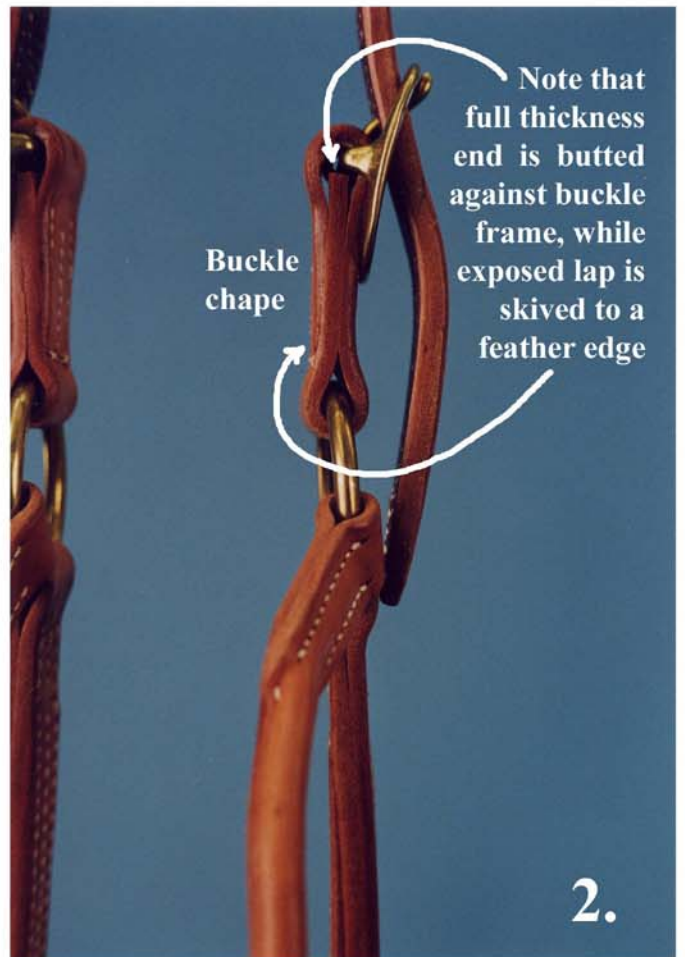
# Parts of the Track Halter



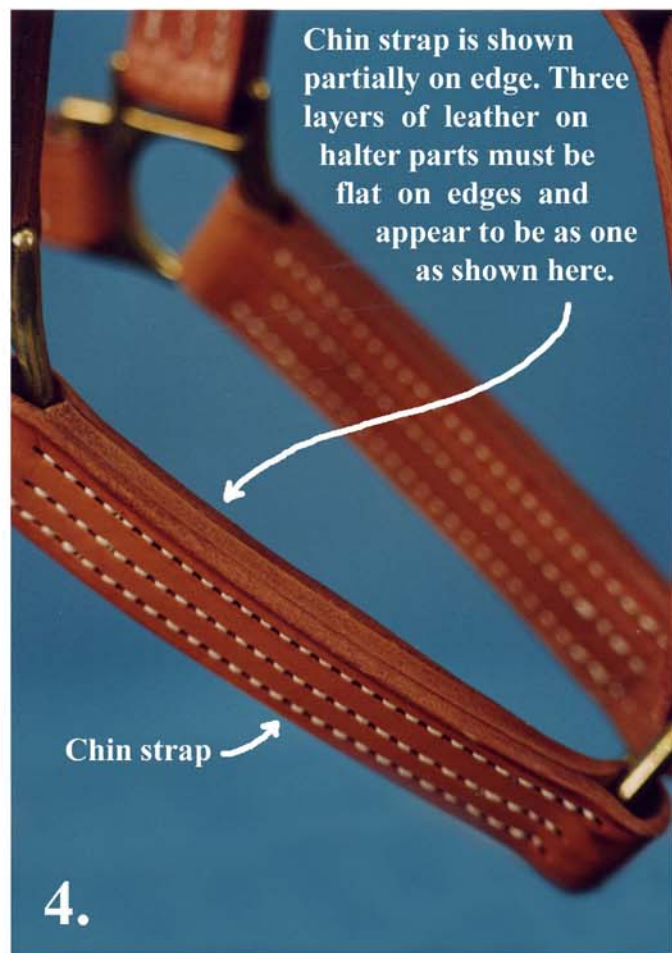
Noseband lining is made from latigo for ease in cleaning. Noseband lap is skived to a feather edge so that there are never any lumps next to a horse's fragile skin on the nasal area.



Note that full thickness end is butted against buckle frame, while exposed lap is skived to a feather edge



Chin strap is shown partially on edge. Three layers of leather on halter parts must be flat on edges and appear to be as one as shown here.



Backside view of cheek piece showing how edge layers are flat. Edges are rounded only on final edge. Middle layer is not rounded on edges. Also note that full thickness of leather at hardware end is cut square allowing it to butt up against halter square, keeping it at a right angle to the hardware. The stress is taken up by the leather and not by the stitching. The lap end is skived to almost a feather edge, about 1-2 oz in thickness. A true feather edge will curl with time, making a lump on the underside of the cheeks. Avoid any bumps or rough spots on the inside of a halter, since a horse has no protection for his facial skin.
